The wounded man asked, "Is she alive?" and was answered that she was. He muttered indistinctly several times, and those around heard him say, "You'll find it all in a letter in a tin box." As this proved to be an explanation of the tragedy a search was at once commenced, but neither box nor letter could be found.
