The M. W. the Grand Master instructed the V. W. Grand Pursuivant, to provide the necessary convenience for visiting Brethren to the Grand Lodge, and a large number of Master Masons entered and took their seats.

M. W. Bro. Laurie, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia, and R. W. Bro. Robert Ramsay, Hon. Grand Junior Warden of this Grand Lodge having been announced, were received with Grand Honors and having been heartily welcomed by the M. W. the Grand Master took their seats on the Dais.

The Order of Business prepared by the Grand Secretary was approved of by the M. W. the Grand Master, and distributed through Grand Lodge.

The Grand Secretary read the Rules and Regulations for the government of the Grand Lodge during the time of business, and was proceeding to read the minutes of the last Annual Communication, held in the City of Montreal, on the 25th and 26th of September, 1879-5879, when the same was dispensed with on the following motion, made by R. W. Bro. C. Judge, D. G. M., seconded by R. W. Bro. A. F. Simpson, and adopted:—

That, inasmuch as the minutes of the proceedings of this Grand Lodge, at its last Annual Communication, have been printed and distributed amongst the Lodges under this jurisdiction, the same be held as read, and are hereby confirmed.

W. Bro. Knowles rose and stated that he had been requested by R. W. Bro. Wm. Miller, P.D.D.G.M. for Quebec and Three Rivers, to inform Grand Lodge that the requirements of his business had prevented him from attending his duties in Grand Lodge, and
