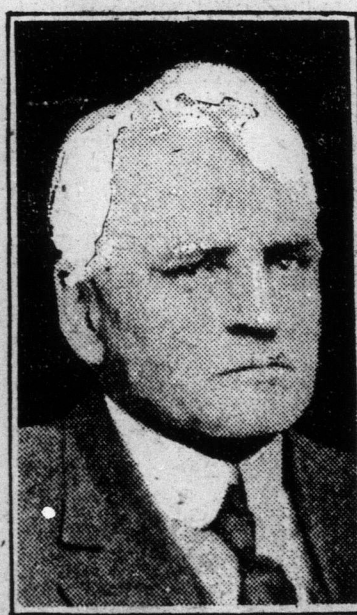

SAYS IMMIGRANTS WILL BE SELECTED

Thousands of Ex-Service Men Being Sent To Canada.

LONDON, March 3.—Canadian Associated Press.—Publication of the supplementary estimates of the colonial office, showing that £650,000 (\$3,250,000) is asked for to provide free passages for ex-service men to the Dominions, has caused some speculation as to the probable attitude of the dominions on this emigration.

Replying to criticisms, Col. Amery, parliamentary secretary for the colonial office, reiterated previous statements that the Government had no intention of dumping the unemployed of these islands upon the dominions. All those being given free or assisted passages, he declared, had first to be passed by the immigration officials of the dominions. In regard to women emigrants, Col. Amery said supervision of them was done better by voluntary agencies than by Government officials.

ALLEGES HE WAS DEPRIVED OF PROFITS

TORONTO, March 3.—An action which is calculated to evoke more than usual interest is one launched by Hon. F. R. Latchford, a Judge of the supreme court of Ontario, against the Canada Life Assurance Company. Charges made by Mr. Justice Latchford declared that the company adopted a system of accounting which deprived policyholders of the profits to which they were entitled. This is denied by the company. Mr. Justice Latchford has asked that the action shall be tried by a jury.

Mr. Justice Latchford's claim is that he is entitled to at least \$3,500 in profits in addition to \$7,070, the amount of an endowment policy taken out by him on August 2, 1899.

DEATH OF MRS. BARROW.
INGERSOLL, March 3.—Following a very brief illness, the death of Mrs. Barrow, aged 48, wife of Fred A. Barrow, occurred at the family residence. She was a member of St. James' Anglican Church. Beside the husband, she is survived by two daughters and two sons.

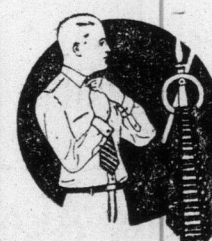
