

BERNACHEZ, NAZARE. (*Montmagny*.)

Descended from Jean Barnesehe and Marie Chretien, who settled in St. Thomas de Montmagny in 1737, and were married there two years later. B. in St. Thomas de Montmagny, 12 Feb. 1838, and received an elementary education there. M., Oct. 1859, Henriette Conillard Despres. Is a farmer. Was Postmaster for eighteen months, and has been a Councillor, Mayor and Préfet of Montmagny. First returned to Leg. Assem. Jan. 1883, on the sitting mem. Mr. Fortin, being unseated. An Independent Liberal.—*Montmagny, P.Q.*

BLANCHET, Hon. JEAN, Q.C. (*Rouer.*)

Descended from one of the oldest French settlers in La Nouvelle France. S. of C. Blanchet, N. P. of St. François, Co. of Rennece. B. Feb. 1843. Ed. at the Coll. of Nicolet. M. 5 Aug. 1878, Jennie, dau. of General S. Seymour, of Albany, State Engineer of the State of New York.—Called to the Bar L.C. 3 Oct. 1863. Apptd. a Q.C. by the Govt. of P.Q. Feb. 1876, and by the Dominion Govt. 11 Oct. 1880. Is a mem. of the Council of the Bar, Quebec Section. Is Presdt. of the Cartier Club; Vice-Presdt. of the Artisans Permanent Building Soc.; and Presdt. of the Asbestos Mining and Manufacturing Co. of Can. Sworn of the Executive Council, and apptd. Provl. Secretary 31 July 1882. Was an unsuccessful candidate at g.e. 1872. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. by acclamation. Re-elected by acclamation, on accepting office. A Liberal Conservative.—*Quebec.*

BOYER, ARTHUR. (*Jacques Cartier.*)

S. of Louis Boyer, a merchant in Montreal, by his wife, Amelie Mignault. B. in Montreal, 9 Feb. 1851. Ed. there and in London, Eng. M. in 1875, Miss Ernestine Galarneau. First returned to Leg. Assem. for present seat at bye election held 27 Mar. 1884, on the resignation of the sitting member, Hon. Mr. Mousseau. A Liberal.—*Montreal.*

BROUSSEAU, JEAN DOULE. (*Portneuf.*)

S. of the late M. J. B. Brousseau, of Ste. Augustine, P. Q. B. at Quebec. Ed. at the Seminary there. M. Mary, dau. of the late B. Downes, Esq., High Constable of Que-
