Retired in 1874, to take position on Attending Staff. Was appointed in succession in McGill Medical Faculty : Lecturer on Hygiene (1872), Demonstrator of Anatomy (1874), and the following year Professor of Clinical Surgery ; held the latter Chair for fifteen years, when, on the retirement of the late Dr. G. E. Fenwick, he was promoted to the Chair of Surgery, which he still holds. Is also Consulting Surgeon with the Montreal General and Royal Victoria Hospitals. Has served in the Militia force almost continuously since 1868, when he was appointed Assist. Surgeon Grand Trunk Rifle Brigade, later commanded the University Corps attached to the Prince of Wales Rifles, and then appointed Surgeon of the latter regiment, which position he still holds. On the outbreak of the North-West Rebellion in 1885, he was selected by the Government to take charge of medical affairs in the field, and received the rank of Deputy Surgeon-General of Militia ; organized the hospitals and medical service for the Expeditionary Force, and was recommended for C.M.G. by the General in command. Was Presdt. of the Canadian Medical Association in 1891, and is now Presdt. elect of the British Medical Association. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1896.
