- Of T. S. Cartwright and others, of the City of Hamilton; praying that Canadian Publishers may be placed on the same footing as foreigners as regards printing British Copyright Works.
- Of the Montreal Board of Trade; praying that further time be allowed for the consideration of the changes in Banking Regulations proposed by the Minister of Finance.
- ()f the Montreal Board of Trade; praying that no alteration be made in the existing Law regulating the interest of money.
- Of the Chamber of Commerce of Milwaukee,—of the Board of Trade of the City of Chicago,—of Vincent Wilson and others, members of the Board of Trade of the said City of Chicago,—of J. B. Johnston and others, members of the Chamber of Commerce, Merchants and business men of the City of Milwaukee aforesaid, in the United States of America, severally praying for the incorporation of the Eric and Ontario Canal Company.
