by the north-east boundary line of the Seigniory of Contrecœur, thence up the River Richelieu or Chambly, on the cast side thereof to the north-east bounds of the Seigniory of Rouville, thence running from the River Richelicu or Chambly, south-easterly, along said Seigniory of Rouville to the depth thereof; thence southeasterly along the rear line of said Seigniory to the north-east boundary line of the augmentation of the Seigniory of Monnoir; thence along said boundary line, south-easterly, to its depth; thence, south-westerly, along the rear line of said augmentation, to the north-west angle of the rest and residue of the Township of Farnham; thence, south-east, along said rest and residue of Farnham, to the middle of the River of Yamaska; thence, down the said River, to the line dividing the Seigniory of St. Hyacinthe from the said Township of Farnham; thence, south-easterly, along the said line last mentioned, being the north-east boundary line of said Township, to the most southerly angle of the said Seigniory of St. Hyacinthe; thence, northeasterly, along the line dividing the depth of said Seigniory from the said Township of Farnham, to the south-westerly angle of the Township of Granby; thence, easterly, along the division line between the Townships of Granby and Farnham, Shefford and Brome, to the north-east angle of Brome; thence, south, along the division line between the said Township of Brome, and the Township of Bolton, and between Satton and Potton to the southern boundary of the Province; and shall comprehend all the Islands in the River St. Lawrence, (or Lake St. Peter,) adjacent to the said County, and in the whole, or in part, fronting the same, that is to say, the Isles St. Ignace, Cochon, Madame, Rond de Grace, Aux Ours, and the Islands commonly called Batture à la Carpe, and the Isles au Sable, du Moine, de Barque and du Pas; and together also with all the Islands in the River Sorel, Richelieu, or Chambly, nearest to the said County, and in the whole, or in part, fronting the same. The County of Bedford shall be bounded on the north-east by the south-west boundary line of the County of Richelieu as above mentioned, on the west by the River Richelieu or Chambly, and on the south by the southern boundary of the Province, and shall comprehendall the Islands in the said River Sorel, otherwise called Richelieu or Chambly, nearest to the said County, and in whole or in part fronting the same, incloding the Isle aux Noix. The County of Surrey shall be bounded on the north-east by the south-west boundary line of the Seigniory of St. Ours, running from the St. Lawrence south-easterly, along said boundary line to the River Richelieu, or Chambly, on the southwest by the north-east boundary lines of the ...
