

Judges are now deciding who will receive Jaycees' award

All the nominations have been submitted and a panel of three well-known Mississaugans are deciding who will be the Three Outstanding Young Citizens of Mississauga for 1980.

The three who will receive the award, co-sponsored by the Mississauga Jaycees and

The Mississauga Times, will be honored at a dinner-dance Nov. 27 at the Meadowvale Inn. Tickets at \$15 per person are available from the Jaycees/Jayettes and The Times.

This is the first year the Mississauga Jaycees have thrown their annual award open to the public

and have added three non-Jaycees to the judging panel. Lois Gibson, general manager of the Mississauga City Board of Trade, Bill Kent, chairman of the Peel Board of Education, and Richard Desrochers, publisher of The Times.

They will be judging the nominees on the basis

of the Jaycee Creed, which adheres to the principles of community involvement and the development of leadership qualities. Nominees must be Canadian citizens, residents of the city between 18 and 40 years old, and must have contributed to the quality of life in their communities.

Among the winners in previous years in Mississauga are Mississauga North MPP Terry Jones and Ron Duquette.

All nominees in Mississauga, whether or not they are chosen one of the Three Outstanding Young Citizens here —

are eligible to be honored by the Jaycees national organization as one of Five Outstanding Young Canadians, a program that has been in place for more than a decade. Previous winners of the Vanier Award include Ontario Premier William Davis and entertainers Karen Kain and Gordon Lightfoot.

Meanwhile, the nominations are being studied by the three judges. Mrs. Gibson has been with the board of trade since 1979 and a contributor to the volunteer sector in the city for more than a decade. The mother of three has co-ordinated

political campaigns, commercial and fund-raising fashion shows, and served as president of the Mississauga Hospital Auxiliary and as a director of the board.

Bill Kent has just been re-elected to the board of education, of which he has been chairman since 1978. He has been trustee for ward 2 from 1976 to present and before that, from 1968 to 1972. The father of two is a director and former president of the Meadow Wood-Rattray Residents' Association. As Director of Admissions for the University of Toronto he is also president of the Canadian University

Registrars' Association.

Richard Desrochers, publisher of The Times since 1977, has served with the Mississauga Rotary Club, the Peel Volunteer Centre, Peel Cheshire House and the 1980 Fritterfest Committee. Before being appointed publisher he was assistant publisher of The Times and its sister papers, The Etobicoke Guardian and The Lakeshore Advertiser, and advertising director for the three papers previous to that. He has been a Mississauga resident since 1969 and lives in The Credit Woodlands with his wife, Monique, and their two children, Andre and Rochelle.
