TO HIS EXCELLENCY
THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN COUNCIL:

The undersigned has the honour to report:

THAT Order in Council P.C. 2/1437, dated the 11th day of April, 1946, authorized the purchase of the lands in the Province of Alberta described in the attached schedule, for the Stony Band of Indians of Alberta;

THAT the said lands have been purchased and title is now in His Majesty the King in the Right of Canada;

THAT the Director of Indian Affairs has recommended that the said lands be set apart for the use of the Stony Band of Indians of Alberta.

The undersigned, therefore, recommends that the lands described in the attached schedule be and are hereby set apart for the use and benefit of the Stony Band of Indians of Alberta and that the said lands shall be additions to Stony Indian Reserve Nos. 142, 143 and 144, Alberta.
