AUGUST 28th Organizer Adams visited Paris and conferred with Secretary John Inksater. All the lists have been posted in Brant, and thirty days allowed for appeals has expired. Paris list has been well looked after. John Harold is talked about as Dominion Candidate, but at present is adverse to accepting the responsibility. He is regarded as a very strong man. Hon. William Paterson was the last candidate but impression prevails that he has fully run his course and will not be a candidate again.

× BRANTFORD August 8th, 1912

Organizer W.H. Adams reports from Brantford " I conferred with President John Muir and Secretary W.B. Preston of Brantford Reform Association. Also with F.S. Blain, Secretary, and President Thomas Kirby of the Brantford Liberal Club. Blain is a very capable and well informed man and is in charge of the clerical and detail part of the organization. He has already taken up the revision in each Municipality and County. Only two lists have been posted. I will return again to confer with Morgan Harris who is in active touch with the organization. Brantford Club is in good shape and has good rules. There is a probability that Lloyd Harris will be the next Dominion Candidate. T.H. Preston was the last candidate.

SEPTEMBER 4th

Organizer Adams reports that the time for appeals has expired in the townships of Brantford, Oakland. Messrs. Blain and Morgan Harris state that the work has been well done. These two townships having been revised and as registration prevails in Brantford there is no further out-side assistance required.

★ BROCKVILLE July 1st, 1912

Organizer W.F. Summerhayes conferred with M.C. Franklin Secretary of the Association re Voters List revision etc. Franklin will be responsible for the revision of the Voters Lists in this Riding. There is likely to be a considerable falling off of the population in Brockville as the Grand Trunk shops are to be moved from Brockville to Prescott, and Prescott will become the Divisional point instead of Brockville. Brockville will suffer accordingly and Prescott will gain in population. At this date nothing definite can be reported as to candidates and Brockville may be affected by a re-distribution bill. Hon. George P. Graham was the last candidate and there is some talk that he may stand for Brockville and Leeds if merged into one riding.
