Judges' appointment, tenure and remuneration.

Native Department and Appointment, &c., of officers of Department. 15

(5) Every Minister shall have the right to sit and speak both in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, but shall vote only in the House of which he is a Member.

JUDGES.

38. The Judges of the High Court-

(1) shall be appointed by the Governor in Council;


(2) shall not be removed except by the Governor in Council on an Address from the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly in the same Session praying for such removal on the ground of proved misbehaviour or incapacity;

(3) shall receive such remuneration as shall from time to time be prescribed by Law, but the remuneration of a Judge shall not be diminished during his tenure of office, and the remuneration of the present Judges shall not be diminished, and their commissions shall continue as heretofore.

NATIVE ADMINISTRATION.

39.—(1) There shall be a Native Department, the permanent head of which shall be appointed by the Governor in Council with the approval of the High Commissioner, and all Chief Native Commissioners, Superintendents of Natives, Native Commissioners and Assistant Native Commissioners, or any officers appointed to exercise the functions now exercised by the aforesaid officers or any of them shall be appointed in the like manner and subject to the like approval, and the said officers shall continue to perform the duties at present assigned to them subject to any alterations or additions which the Governor in Council may from time to time, with the approval of the High Commissioner, prescribe by notice in the Gazette.

(2) The salaries of the officers mentioned in the preceding sub-section shall be fixed by the
