Dear Mr. Willoughby:

Was exceedingly disappointed on reaching Moose Jaw to find that you were away and not to be back for some days. The need of speakers is so great that our candidates have become rather discouraged for lack of help on the platform. Wr. White needs this help very badly and also Mr. McKinnon, who is running in Willowbunch. Moosejdaw we have a splendid chance to carry and certainly will carry if the work is done. There were signs of some internal difficulties when I was there and our candidate, being somewhat new at the task, should not be exposed to troubles of this kind. Way I ask you to relieve him of worry to the utmost extend in your power and to assist him in the platform all possible. I think also you should give a couple of meetings to Mr. WoKinnon. He has a very difficult task with but small chance of winning, but the fact that he has taken up the cudgels on our behalf makes it imperative that we do not abandon him.
