interview at Mr Arthur Meighen's office  
at Parliament Building Ottawa March 6<sup>th</sup>  
1923 pursuant to appointment made  
at interview with Mr Meighen at 5:30  
on the same day.

Mr Meighen advised the undersigned - A. J.  
Honeywell and Norman G. Zarnetto at the  
interview at 5:30 that Mr Kennedy Palmer had  
advised him that a prepared deal was going  
through for the purchase of a property by  
a syndicate for the purpose of selling the  
same to the Government. That the syndicate  
was to be composed of three men who were  
to sell it in turn to another man who  
would sell it to the Government, and of the  
three men were to receive \$4000 and four  
ministers of the Government were to receive  
the balance of the profits, that Mr H.C.  
Church was the man through whom the  
transaction was being promoted and the  
property was to be used for a new Postway  
Avenue. That Palmer wanted Mr Meighen  
to arrange to take an interest in the syndicate  
for the purpose of exposing the scheme.  
That Mr Meighen was suspicious that  
it was a scheme to implicate himself  
and considered it advisable for third  
parties to hear the next conversation with  
Palmer in person to Palmer himself. He  
received a message to attend at Mr Meighen  
office at 9:20 in the evening of March 6<sup>th</sup> 1923  
and when Mr Meighen came up a few  
minutes later he advised us that Mr Palmer
