

- Q-16. Would it be possible then to get struck on the left side of the face by a man whose right arm he was holding ?
 A-16. Yes, sir.
 Q-17. Now, when you were struck you fell to the pavement ?
 A-17. Yes, sir.
 Q-18. You retained your hold on Gnr McKinnon ?
 A-18. Yes, sir.
 Q-19. Gnr McKinnon went down with you ?
 A-19. Yes, sir.
 Q-20. The people helped you up from the pavement ?
 A-20. Yes, sir.
 Q-21. Did they help Gnr McKinnon ?

Court interrupts:

President: You must not ask leading questions.

- Q-22. Did you strike Gnr McKinnon ?
 A-22. No, sir.
 Q-23. Did you see anyone strike Gnr McKinnon ?
 A-23. No, sir.
 Q-24. As far as you know Gnr McKinnon was not struck ?
 A-24. No, sir.
 Q-25. Had you had anything to drink in the Hotel ?
 A-25. No, sir.
 Q-26. Nothing ?
 A-26. No, sir.
 Q-27. Who was the Gnr You had taken out previously ?
 A-27. Gnr Jones, I believe it was, sir.
 Q-28. Did you know that Gnr Jones was struck immediately outside the Hotel ?
 A-28. No, sir. I left him at the Hotel door.

Re-examined by the Prosecution.

- Q-29. How far ahead of Gnr McKinnon were you Sgt Featherstone, when you reached the door of the Hotel ?
 A-29. I was standing at the door ahead of him.
 Q-30. When you fell to the ground what happened to you ?
 A-30. I fell on my face.
 Q-31. Did anything unusual occur ?
 A-31. No, sir, I was cut on the forehead.

Prosecution: I think that is all the questions I would like to ask.

2nd Witness for the Prosecution B-16797 Gnr Brophy, F.W. having been duly sworn is examined by the Prosecutor.

- Q-32. Gnr Brophy, do you recognize the accused?
 A-32. Yes, sir.
 Q-33. Do you rememehr the night of 30th Oct 1942 ?
 A-33. Yes, sir, I was in the bar of the Cock Hotel.
 Q-34. Whom did you see there ?
 A-34. Well, sir, I saw three or four fellows, Gnr Dunbar, Gnr Perry and Gnr Allan.
 Q-35. Did you see Gnr McKinnon ?
 A-35. I saw him when the argument started.
 Q-36. What argument started ?
 A-36. Gnr Perry and Gnr McKinnon got in some argument of some sort.
 Q-37. Then what happened ?
 A-37. Sgt Featherstone stepped in and told them not to start anything. He told them to go outside. I followed.
 Q-38. How far between were you ?
 A-38. I was about 4 or 5 fellows between.
 Q-39. When you got to the door of the Hotel, what did you see ?
 A-39. Sgt Featherstone was picking himself off the pavement.
 Q-40. How far away were you at that time from him ?
 A-40. I was about 6 feet, sir.
 Q-41. You say approximately 6 feet ?
 A-41. Yes, sir.
