Second witness C/11453 Pte (A/Cpl) Tucker, T.E.,
Prosecution R.C.A.S.C., H.Q. Cdn. Corps. C.R.(A.F.)
being duly sworn, states:

On the night 11-12th Oct 41 I was in command of the guard at the rear lorry park, H.Q. Cdn. Corps.

At about 0030 hrs 12 Oct 41, Pte Moore whom I now recognize, knocked at the door of the M.C. office. I asked him what he wanted. He replied that he had something for me, whereupon he produced a bottle of wine from the kit bag he was carrying & gave it to me. He then suggested that we should have a drink. I at first refused, but finally, upon insistence, I took a drink. Pte Porte, in the meantime had come in.

During the conversation I learned that the wine had been stolen. I had asked Moore where he got the wine and he replied that some friends had given it to him. But later, from their talk, I learned that it had been stolen; they said they got it from an air-raid shelter. I counted a dozen bottles in the kit bag. About 1:30 or 1:45 a.m. I told them they had better go down their list, which they did. That was the last I saw of them or the wine.

I would both decline to cross examine this witness.
