In October, 1898, the Rev'd. J. S. Chivers succeeded Mr. Watson. The parish of Moose Jaw, shorn of its many outstations, became self-supporting; and in this period the present rector's house was built.

In December, 1903, Mr. Chivers was appointed rector of St. Augustine's, Lethbridge, and was succeeded by the Rev'd. F. Wells Johnson, now Archdeacon. Moose Jaw was now a city with a population of 5,000, and in March, 1905, the work of adding a chancel to the church was commenced, and
