Nays

Messieurs Moore, Frobisher, Mure, Richardson and Young.

And thus it was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Bedard moved to refolve, seconded by Mr. Berthelot,

That the faid Edward Edwards, having printed the faid Libel, is guilty of a high breach of the privileges of this House.

The House divided upon the question, and the votes proving to be the same as upon the last question, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Bedard moved, seconded by Mr. Berthelot,

That the said Isaac Tod, Esquire, be taken into custody of the Serjeant at Arms of this House.

Whereupon the House again divided:

Yeas 10 Nays 5

And the same being carried in the affirmative.

ORDERED, That the faid Isaac Tod, Esquire, be taken into custody by the Serjeant at Arms attending upon this House.

Mr. Bedard then moved, seconded by Mr. Berthelot,

That the faid Edward Edwards, be taken into custody of the Serjeant at Arms of this House.

Mr. Richardson moved, seconded by Mr. Frobisher,

That
