

He accordingly presented the said Bill, to the House, and the same was received and read, for the first time.

RESOLVED, that the said Bill be read a second time on Monday next.

On motion of Mr. *McCord*, seconded by Mr. *Badeaux* ;

ORDERED, that Mr. *McCord* have leave to bring in a Bill to continue the Acts therein mentioned, respecting Aliens, and certain subjects of His Majesty, who have resided in *France*, coming into this Province, or residing therein.

He accordingly presented the said Bill to the House, and the same was received, and read for the first time.

Mr. *McCord* moved, seconded by Mr. *Badeaux*, that the said Bill be read a second time on Tuesday next.

Mr. *Bourdages* moved in amendment, seconded by Mr. *Durocher*, to leave out "Tuesday," and insert "the twentieth of March."
