That it appears from the Accounts of George Cottnam, Efq; Collector of the Duties of Impoft and Excife at Louifbourg, to February, 1768, that there has been collected by him the Sum of  $\pounds 201.7.$  of which there has been paid into the Treafury only  $\pounds 90.$  which with the Charge of  $\pounds 40.$  for Commiffions, and  $\pounds 40.$ for Waiters and Gaugers, and  $\pounds 19.0.6$ ; for other Expences, fuch as Court Houfe, Goal, &c. leaves a Ballance due by him to the Government of  $\pounds 12.6.5^{1}_{4.}$ that there is alfo due by fundry Perfons at Louifbourg for Duties, the Sum of  $\pounds 89.16.10.$  and that no Account of Duties, &c. collected at Louifbourg has been rendered fince February, 1768.

That very little Benefit has arifen to Government from the Collectors of Impost and Excise Duties at *Canfo, Louifbourg, Barrington, Yarmouth, and Liverpool*; and therefore this House requests His Excellency will be pleased to give Directions that the feveral Sums abovementioned, and all other outstanding Debts be paid, and that Measures may be taken for the more effectual collecting and paying into the Treasury the Duties which may arise at those Places.

That the Houfe do alfo further requeft His Excellency will be pleafed to put the feveral Collectors at the Outports on the fame Footing in refpect to their Allowance for collecting the Duties, and not allow any of them Salaries.

That the Houfe is informed there is not at prefent any Collector at *Liverpool*, and that they conceive fuch an Officer to be very neceffary there;

And that the Houfe do humbly requeft His Excellency will pleafe to give Directions to the Treafurer to keep a feperate Account of every Fund, and not blend them together. and that all the publick Accounts may be made up to the 1ft of *July* annually, for the better and
