### Will Kill Kaiser BY SIMPLY WISHING

**Chicago Mental Scientist to Organize 20,000,000 Optimists For Job, at Once**

Chicago, July 3.—Dr. Sheldon Leavitt, President of the American Optimistic League, is going to put the Kaiser out of business. Dr. Leavitt, who says he is a "Mental Scientist" and a "Holy Emotionalist," explained it this way:

"The league has just been organized by me for the life, liberty and pursuit of optimism, and I expect to carry 20,000,000 members. Twice a day the 20,000,000 optimists shall, at a designated hour, concentrate intellectually, grit their teeth, stamp their feet and simultaneously wish the Kaiser, the Germans, the enemy shall be mentally electrocuted."

"I call down upon the German Government disaster, catastrophe, ruin and the pestilence, annihilation and the plague," is the "ritual," and additional misfortunes wished upon the Kaiser's head," Dr. Leavitt said, "it will make it impossible for the courageous heads of the American army and navy to crush the enemy."

### WOOD NEEDED FOR MAKING AIRPLANES

**Canada Could Enormously Increase Output if the Men Were Forthcoming**

"The production of airplanes depends as much upon the supply of suitable lumber as upon any other one thing," says an officer of the Imperial Munitions Board. "The best timber so far discovered for airplane construction is Sitka spruce, which grows abundantly on the Pacific coast, and then only in favored localities, Washington and Oregon States have a fair area of this timber, but Queen Charlotte Island, which is a part of the British Columbia coast, has the greatest area in the world, the trees in some districts averaging eight feet in diameter and running as high as twelve feet."

"Italy and France are securing their supplies in the United States, while England also is buying part of her needs there. It is stated that 70,000 men are engaged in the woods and mills of Oregon and Washington. In British Columbia, however, the supply of labor is very limited, and only 3,000 men are now employed, although thousands more could be used."

"There is practically no limit to the necessities of England and the Allies for airplane timber. While the actual footage required for an airplane is not great in order to secure the quantity of the proper specifications from ten to fifteen times as much lumber must be cut. This will give some idea of the labor involved in producing the timber for airplanes. To do with a timber Johnson Hicks says, many thousands will be needed."
