A glance at the writhing form of the workman, who groaned forn screamed with pain, showed what had happened. He had taken hold of the pulley to swing the safe, and his fingers had caught in the rope and drawn into the sheaves of the block His fellow workmen knew that to tur the winch either hoist or lower the safe mighht result in crushing the poor fellow's hand to a pulp. There was only one to do-the ropes must be cut and the safe allowed to drop to the sidewalk. As quickly as possible the sidewalks and the roadway were cleared of pedestrians and vehicles T'wo stout fellows lay out upon the sill and held the body of their suffering comrade so that he would not be carried down with the safe.
