

# WILLIAM CAMERON KILLED

### Horses Take Fright During Thunder Storm on Dome and Upset Wagon—Driver Was Crushed to Death Almost Instantly.

A most deplorable accident in which William Cameron was instantly killed occurred yesterday at about 4 o'clock in the afternoon near the Dome roadhouse and the junction of Hunker, Dominion and Sulphur roads.

Cameron was a driver in the employ of Woodson & Williams, freighters. He left Dawson at an early hour yesterday morning for Sulphur with a load of three tons drawn by four horses. He reached the dome just as a severe thunder storm began. The horses took fright and started to run. Cameron who was a powerfully built man held them up but in some way a turn was made upsetting the wagon. Cameron fell beneath and was instantly crushed.

William Cameron was well known in Dawson having been in the country since some time in '89. His brother John Cameron owns a house on Sulphur and Malcolm McKinnon of the Dawson fire department is his cousin. The unfortunate man had charge of a roadhouse on Dominion during the past winter and spring and only quit a few days ago to enter the employ of the freighters, yesterday being his first trip.

John Cameron, the dead man's brother, went from Sulphur to Gold Run yesterday and could not be reached by telephone until this morning when he was given the sad news of his brother's death. He would go to the Dome roadhouse today and take charge of the body. Sergeant Marshal of Caribou was instructed by Major Cuthbert to repair to the scene of the accident and make official inquiry into the same and report at once. In case an inquest is necessary Captain Routledge will go to the dome for that purpose.

William Cameron was a single man and 48 or 50 years of age. He was

that has come straight through from the sound ready buyers \$11 to \$11 50. There has also been a slump in lemons and oranges. Since last week the former has been quoted at \$12.50 and the latter at \$11. Bananas are disposed of as fast as they arrive at the city bringing from \$12 to \$14. Butter is plentiful and is coming at \$24 to 25 cents a pound. Eggs are quoted at 25. These are the same as last week. A fair load of any of the produce is shipped in a day and the following should be noted. There would be almost no surplus of any article. There is not an improper number of whole sales in the city. When a sale is made money and goods are not hoarded. The Dawson market may now be said to have settled down to a normal condition. There is no thing that is still in demand greater than the produce and for the reason that the excess being considered not for a possible order, other freight has been given a preference at Whitehorse. At that point there are said to be vast loads of cream of all brands and it will begin arriving doubtless within a day or two as most of the perishable freight has already been forwarded. There is practically no Highland in the city at present and not a great deal of any other brand. St. Charles and Jersey creaming and both being quoted at the same price, \$9.50 and \$10 Milk is also still very high. A small quantity of Redford being about all that is left.

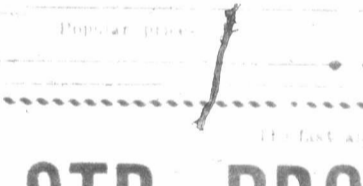
