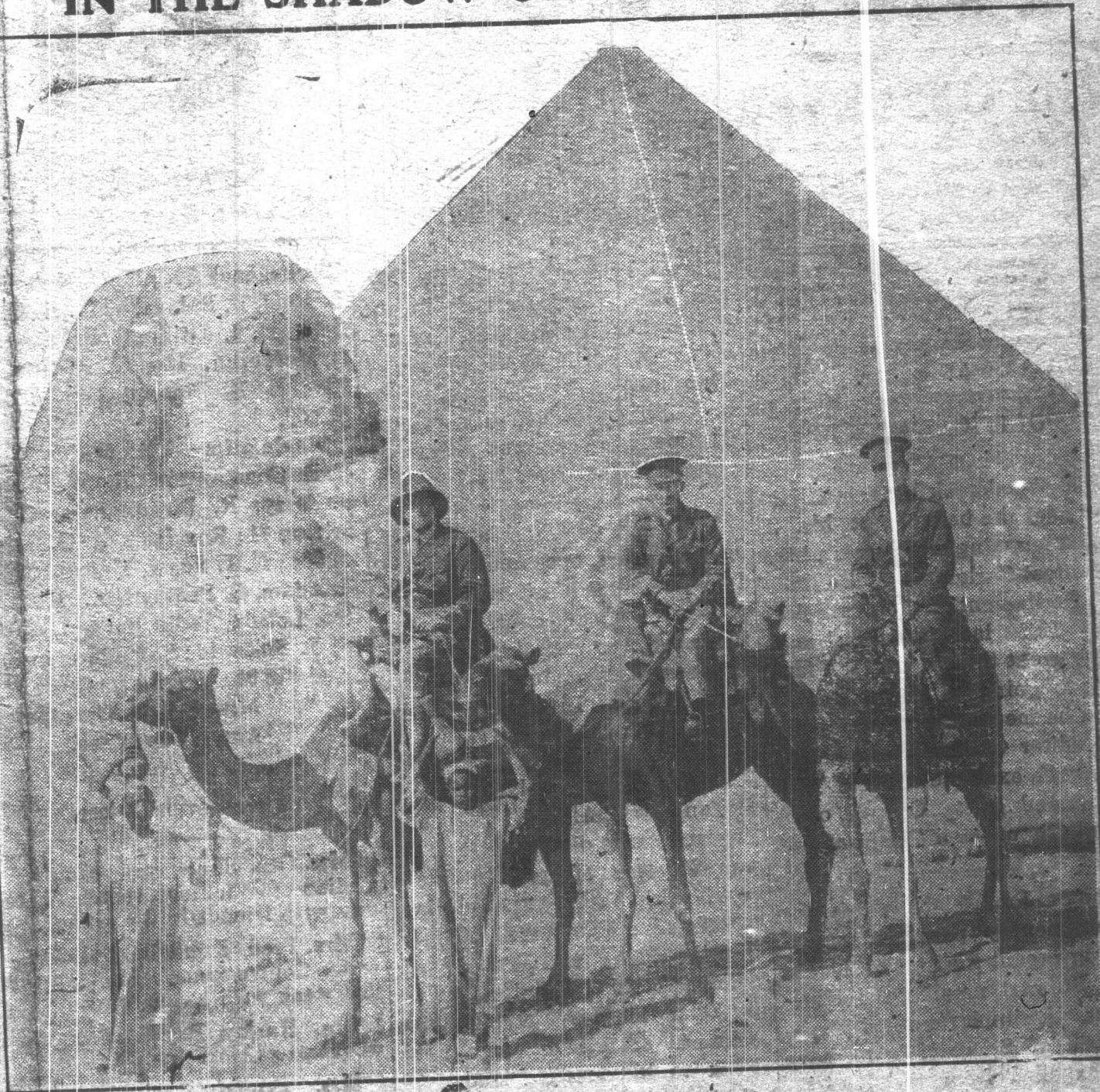

### SEED FAIR

The annual Carleton County Seed Fair was held at Florenceville on March 14 under the auspices of the Agricultural Society of which A. D. McCain is president and F. S. Taylor, secretary. There was a good attendance, and the exhibits were fully up to the standard of previous years. The potatoes, beans and wheat were particularly good. The quality of the wheat grown in this section is indicated by the fact that there were sixteen entries of White Fife wheat. The committee was Dr. R. B. Hagerman, with the president and secretary. The judges were S. J. Moore and F. L. Fuller.
