Ottawa, May 21—Supplementary estimates were laid on the table to day. They total \$23,470,316,65, of which \$6,141,506.67 is on capital, and \$17,328,809,99 on current account. The largest single item is \$4,000,000 to provide for the construction, cacquistion, leasing or expropriation of terminal elevation. Another interesting item is \$1,500,000 for good roads; it will be remembered that the vote which the Senate last year—amended was for \$1,000,000.
