A CAMPAIGN THAT TESTS MEN

The present campaign for the election of a new Parliament will test both the electors and the politicians of Canada.

On the one side men will be urged who not in name only but in heart and in deed believe in justice for the common people.

At this moment Canadians have not that freedom of opportunity to sell or to buy foodstuffs the products of the harvest field or of the orchard or of the garden or of the dairy or of the forest or of the fishing industry.

The distinction of this campaign is that the producer who has foodstuffs to sell declares and has declared for years that he neither wants nor needs any tariff protection or special privilege in the markets where the Canadian consumer buys.

But there are men who deny that right to the producer to sell freely and to the consumer to buy freely. Some of them are middlemen who desire the chance to take toll from both.

We are told that among those opponents of this proposal to make trade in foodstuffs and natural products free from high tariffs and from the monopoly burdens created under high tariffs, are certain men who are Liberals.


Liberalism alike in Britain and in Canada. In the light of this campaign they discover their true political whereabouts and are discovered to their friends.
