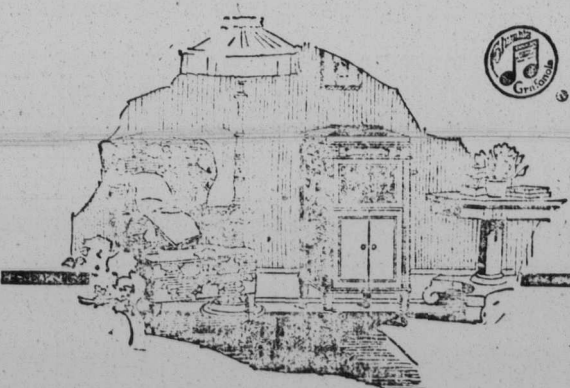

Wonderful Escape At Niagara Falls

Lad Went Over 200-Foot Cliff and Will Live

Niagara Falls, March 12—Maurice Knight, a twelve-year-old lad, is still alive and likely to recover from a two-hundred foot drop over a precipice of Niagara River. The boy, who lives on the American side, was playing with other lads when, to avoid a companion, he made a jump right over the bank. An alarm was immediately sounded, and firemen arrived with extension ladders and ropes. It was believed the lad had caught on a tree or landed in a crevice on the face of the cliff, because he could not be seen from the top of the bank, but while the searchers were trying to locate him, a motorman on the Gorge Railway, two hundred feet below, discovered him lying on the tracks, just in time to avoid running over him. Doctors declare the boy is not seriously injured.

Miss Lynch Alleges 22-Year Courtship

Says Pumphrey Finally Married Girl of 23

Boston Globe—The \$10,000 breach of promise suit of Margaret V. Lynch of Marlboro, against Michael Pumphrey, also of Marlboro, was begun in Superior Court at East Cambridge with Judge White presiding.

The plaintiff is 52 years old and the defendant 51. They kept company about 22 years it is alleged, when he married another woman. Miss Lynch works in a Marlboro shoe factory and Pumphrey is a night watchman at the Payville dam of the Metropolitan water system.

Miss Lynch testified she first met Pumphrey at a dance and they began keeping company. After five years he asked her to marry him, but he was out of work and for a few years his employment was uncertain. After that he got steady employment and they frequently talked of marriage. In August, 1916, he bought a house and stocked it with coal and other supplies. He was always affectionate and considerate, but on Jan. 13, 1918, he married Annie Roach, of Marlboro, who is only 23.

Hun Executed For Robbery

Caught With Jewels Valued at 800,000 Marks

London, March 13—A Copenhagen despatch says that the nature of the fighting between government troops and Spartacan bands in the Eastern suburbs of Berlin seems to indicate that local Spartacan groups have been formed for "no other purpose than to plunder the city."

An Amsterdam telegram received here says that on Monday a Spartacan adherent was captured, and in his possession were found jewels valued at 800,000 marks. The message adds that the man was executed.

New York, March 12—A man identified by the police as Martin Sellers, of this city, was strangled to death in a deserted hallway in West 62nd St. today. The pockets of his clothing were turned inside out, indicating that robbery was the motive of the murder.

St. Thomas College Destroyed by Fire

Chatham, March 13—This town was thoroughly alarmed by the fire which early this morning when St. Thomas' College, comprising all the buildings in connection with the pro-Cathedral, was burned to the ground, and smaller fires set over nearly the entire town by flying cinders. Fortunately these incipient blazes were suppressed, and the fire has been localized about the college buildings, which are, however, a total loss. Nearly 100 boys, boarding at the institution, escaped in their night clothes, and it is regarded as almost miraculous that none were killed or injured. Nothing was saved in the buildings.

The fire department responded quickly to the alarm at 1:15 a. m., but put up a losing fight against the flames, which had a firm grip of the four-story wooden structure before their arrival. Situated on a high hill overlooking the town, the burning building presented a danger to the wooden district below, but practically the entire town was aroused and as soon as the flying cinders found lodgment on roofs and walls they were instantly drenched with waiting bucket brigades. Besides the boarding students the college as also attended by about 200 boys from Chatham and vicinity as day boarders. The lads could do nothing to aid in the fighting, but stood around shivering in their pyjamas and watched the struggle.

The college is conducted as an academy and preparatory school by the Basilican Fathers, and has been in operation for a few years only. The students have made a good reputation in scholastic attainments as well as athletics.

All the seventy-five students escaped in perfect safety, due to excellent discipline and cool presence of mind of the instructors and older boys.

Father Passcho, instructor of mathematics, was delayed in the building and became confused by the overwhelming smoke. He managed to reach a window on the third floor and flung no other exit, jumped from there to the ground. He was picked up unconscious and badly injured, and rushed to the Bishop's Palace, where he received medical attention.

Edward O'Donnell, of Barham, had his face badly burned and his eyebrows singed, when he bravely rushed down a burning stairway, the only exit he could find.

The fire, which was discovered at one o'clock, is supposed to have originated from defective wiring. When the alarm was given, a thin cloud of smoke was seen issuing from one of the upper windows, but by the time all the boys had been safely removed sheets of flame were bursting through the walls. The students had been rescued in the nick of time.

When it was seen that the building was doomed, Chief William Skidd and his fire brigade directed their efforts to saving the adjoining buildings. A bad blaze on the Whitty property was checked, the college rink was saved.

St. Thomas' College was founded eight years ago by the Basilican Fathers, and its present head is Rev. Fr. William Roche, D.D. The building was a large wooden structure, four storeys high, and covered the site of the former pro-Cathedral.
