CABLE NEWS.

Special to Evening Telegram: WASHINGTON, June 12.

A deadlock between both houses of Congress over the Senate's proposal to repeal the Canadian reciprocity law was foreshadowed when the Senate, by a vote of 32 to 27, refused to recede from its amendment to the Iron and Steel Revision Bill.

Special to Evening Telegram: SHERIDAN, Wyoming, June 12.

A wall of water from a cloud burst swept down Clear Creek Canyon on the town of Buffalo, partly wrecking the place and probably causing a number of deaths. Water has entered the second story of the telephone exchange and all communication has been cut off. Buffalo has 2,900 inhabitants.

Special to Evening Telegram: LONDON, June 12.

A heavy fall of snow occurred in Nottinghamshire to-day. The roads are covered with lumps of ice. The fruit crop is badly damaged.

The Guards won the toss and chose the western end, having the advantage of the wind. Play opened at 7.10.

The C. L. B. became aggressive and brought the ball west. Winter had control but lost to Barrett who sent the ball to Church Lads' territory. The M. G. B. boys kept a splendid rush, while their opponents made a sturdy defence. Confining play to the back division of the C. L. B., ranks the Guards increased the pace of their attack and unfortunately as Gear was about to beat Marshall, Quick infringed and the C. L. B. were awarded a "free kick." The ball was next captured at midfield by Bastow, who, after the best run so far this season, passed all opponents and landed the leather in the "meshes," securing first blood for his team.

Instead of discouraging this invigorated the C. L. B., they started at a brisk pace and kept the Guards' backs busy. Hunt, Winter and Croucher got in some pretty combination work. For a while it looked as if honours would be equalized and excitement and enthusiasm ran high amongst C. L. B. supporters. Up to half time no further scoring was done and the teams crossed.

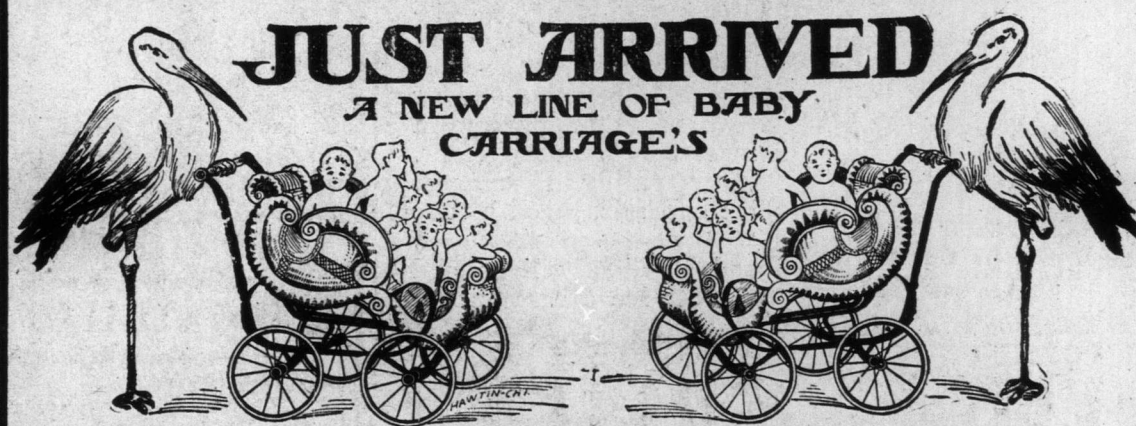
