Nomination Day.

BENNETT CANDIDATES RECEIVE POPULAR DEMONSTRATION.

The enthusiasm displayed at nomination yesterday in the city gave unmistakable signs that Sir Bennett's Candidates would be returned for St. John's.

WEST END NOMINATION.

In the West End Sir M. P. Cashin was the first nominated and he received a big demonstration from his friends and supporters. The poorest spectacle was witnessed when the Prime Minister, Sir R. A. Squires, was nominated. Not a cheer was heard, not a word was spoken and the Premier passed from the nomination both without the least bit of enthusiasm. It was indeed a contrast to 1919 when Sir Richard was given an ovation. Mr. W. F. Linegar, the Labor Candidate on the Opposition ticket in St. John's West received a tremendous ovation. He was accompanied by several hundred committee men, and was cheered to the echo. He thanked the gathering for their reception which spoke the sentiments of St. John's West.

Mr. C. E. Hunt, like Sir Michael and Mr. Linegar, shared in the popular demonstration to the West End candidates, and it is seldom such a spontaneous outburst was seen.

ST. JOHN'S EAST NOMINATION.

At the East End the Opposition candidates were given a popular demonstration. Hundreds of supporters were present, and as the candidates appeared they were given a whole-hearted reception. After nomination Higgins, Fox and Vincombe addressed the voters, thanking them for their extraordinary attendance, which was in marked contrast to the lack of reception given Government nominees who left the scene without receiving a cheer. An independent candidate, Mr. Brian Dunfield, was also nominated.


