The London Spectator has compiled a list of the wealthy Englishmen who have died during the last ten years. From this, it appears that between 1863 and 1872, ten persons havefexpired in Great Britain, leaving to their heirs more than a million sterling. During the same period, fifty-three people have died worth half a million, and one hundred and sixty-one leaving more than a quarter of a million sterling. These figures refer solely to what is called "personality" in English probate records, i. e., actual hard cash, or its equivalent in bonds, stocks, business interests, furniture, pictures, &c. The fortunes represented by the great and small landed estates transmitted during the same period are not included in the statistics referred to. A century ago there was probably not a man in England who possessed the equivalent, in any form, of half a million sterling. Clearly, large fortunes grow in the British Isles, whatever else may be becoming stunted.
