The first session of the Congregational Union of Ontario and Quebec, the fiftieth annual meeting of which is being held in this city, will begin at 9 o'clock tomorrow morning at the First Congregational Church, Dundas street. It is expected that over a hundred delegates will be in attendance, and tonight will see a good portion of this number arrive in the city.
