

ESTABLISH NEW HIGH IN SEVERAL STOCKS

Usually Dull Issues Have Spectacular Rise in New York.

Associated Press Despatch. New York, Nov. 22.—Speculation was rampant in a number of the ordinary inactive stocks in the afternoon and several new records for the year were established, including United States Steel, International Paper, and tobacco products. A block of 12,000 shares of the last mentioned changed hands at 61 1/2. Tidewater Oil extended its decline to eight points, but quite a number of other industrials and specialties showed advances of three to four points.

Erratic fluctuations in Davidson Chemical, which lost all its four-point gain, selling of Chesapeake and Ohio on speculative uncertainty over the dividend action today, and renewed liquidation of the general leather issues, which touched new lows for the year, unsettled the market during the first hour. United Cigar Stores dropped 3 1/2 points. Tidewater Oil four, and General Electric two, and local traction, however, showed consistent growth strength, the demand for the former being influenced by another increase in the price of refined sugar. Adams Express advanced 3 1/2 points in further reflection of a highly successful start. Towards mid-day the whole list tended for higher ground under leadership by General Electric, Canadian Pacific, and the steel shares. Iron products jumped 5 1/2 points and the tobacco share five, while American Bell Sugar, Cuban Dominican Sugar, preferred, and National Supply each rose two points. Call money opened at 4 1/2 per cent.

ALBERTA'S BOND ISSUE NOW FULLY SUBSCRIBED

Canadian Press Despatch. Edmonton, Nov. 22.—The recent \$2,000,000 refund of the provincial government has now been fully taken up, according to news received by the treasury department from New York, and the bonds will be delivered to the purchasers on Friday or Monday. The buyers of the debentures are well distributed all over the United States, the issue having been handled by some 300 dealers. Financial papers in the East have commented upon the sale of the refund bonds, and it is stated that the effect has been to stimulate new interest in Canadian bonds, which have not been in demand on the United States markets.
