

STILL TREMBLING. FURTHER EARTHQUAKE SHOCKS IN SPAIN.

The Total Loss of Life Estimated at Two Thousand—Shocking Brutality as a Result of the Irish Coercion Act Probable—Farnell and the Redistribution Bill—Cholera in Spain—Negotiations for the Egyptian Conference.

EGYPTIAN FINANCES.

Negotiations are in progress, looking to the resumption of the conference on Egyptian finances.

CHOLERA IN SPAIN.

Cholera has not yet entirely disappeared from Spain. At Toledo yesterday there were three fresh cases and one death.

REVOLUTION IN COLOMBIA.

The States of Santander, Boyaca, Cauca, and Magdalena have been declared in revolution.

NOT CONFIRMED.

The British Government has received no advice confirming the report that Russian agents at Cairo are treated by the Amir with unusual regard and have access to his confidential correspondence with the Indian Government.

THE IRISH COERCION ACT.

It is understood that the Government has decided, at the next session of Parliament, to introduce a bill to prolong the operation of the Irish Coercion Act, which expires by limitation next year.

FARNELL AND REDISTRIBUTION.

At the last moment Mr. Farnell abandoned his intention of speaking at the mass meeting of the Irish Nationalists, held in Dublin yesterday. He will reserve his comments on the redistribution bill and incorporate them in a formal address to his constituents, which will be issued in a few days.

SHOCKING BRUTALITY ON BOARD SHIP.

The evidence taken at Liverpool in the case of Second Mate William Raucher and Boatman Ferdinand Kottelnie, of the American ship T. P. Chapman, arrested on the day of a charge of having murdered a Russian seaman named Jansen, shows that defendant daily struck and kicked deceased, that one morning they dragged him out of his bunk, severely flogged him and then lashed him to the topmast shrouts for hours with hands tied in front of him; that he moaned piteously to be cut down, and next morning was insensible and soon died. The deceased left son Francisco in good health. In one instance he was compelled to carry a heavy capstan bar. The examination ended to day, and the prisoners were remanded.

MORE EARTHQUAKES IN SPAIN.

A Madrid despatch says—Further earthquake shocks were experienced yesterday at Val, Malaga, a city of 18,000 people, near Malaga. The shocks were violent. Many houses that had been previously damaged were utterly destroyed. People were terror-stricken and hastily abandoned the city. They are encamped outside the town, and the telegraph stations have been removed to the same place. One thousand houses at Alham are in ruins. The work of searching for the bodies of the dead was vigorously prosecuted yesterday, and 122 bodies recovered. Shocks occurred between 10 a. m. and 11 p. m. There was further loss of life and property at Periana, Rioverde, Venuela, and Alhanyo. It is estimated that the total number of persons killed on Christmas is 2,000. The town of Albuquerque was completely destroyed. Many people perished, including several local officials. Subscriptions for the relief of sufferers have been started at Madrid, Malaga and Granada. The King subscribed \$6,000.

SULLIVAN KNOCKS OUT A WITNESS.

Boston, December 31.—Between 5 and 6 o'clock Sunday evening John L. Sullivan entered Yeaton's saloon, at No. 105 Washington street, and called for supper. Ross Booth, a witness, asked him what he wanted and he made an insulting answer, to which the girl replied with spirit. Sullivan arose in a towering temper and struck her on the face with a wet driving glove. He then hit her a heavy blow with his clenched fist, cutting an ugly gash over her right eye, from which the blood spouted out. The girl fell heavily upon the floor. Not satisfied with the knock-out he commenced kicking her and caused her very serious injury, from which she is reported to be still suffering acute pain. There was no one in the saloon who was able to undertake the task of putting him out, and he set down and coolly ate his supper. His team had been standing at the door all the while, and when he finished eating he went outside and began kicking the horse. When this ceased to amuse him he got into the vehicle and drove leisurely away.

UPRISING MINERS IN HOEKING VALLEY.

Columbus, Ohio, Dec. 31.—There was a general uprising in Hoeking Valley last night. Sheriff McCarthy, with a large posse, on a special train left Logan at a late hour to break the mob. A large shipment of dynamite was received at Nelsonville on Monday. Attacks were made on a railroad bridge. Special officers are being sworn in and taken to the region of Buchtel, where the strikers are said to be concentrating. Communications cut. Officers of the Hoeking Valley Railway & Coal Exchange report everything quiet in the valley this morning, though they express the opinion that there will be trouble to-night.

A RACE OF DAF MUTES.

Interesting Paper by Professor Bell on the Mute Race—Congress to be called to order by Prof. Alexander Graham Bell upon the formation of deaf variety of the human race, showing the marriage of the deaf. Prof. Bell says it is evident that the tendency among deaf mutes to select deaf mates as partners in marriage has been continuously exhibited during the past 40 or 50 years and there is every probability that such unions will continue in future. "We cannot at present arrive at any percentage," he continues, "it is certain that the proportion of deaf unions is many times greater than the proportion born to the people at large. The reports of the American Academy of the New York, Ohio, Indiana and Illinois institutions show that in each institution deaf mutes have been received belonging to families containing five, six, seven, or more deaf mutes, and there is abundant evidence to indicate that such families are very numerous in the United States. In some cases where there are five or six children of one family deaf and dumb, some of them marry when they grow up, all in many cases being married to deaf mutes. These deaf mutes thus happen to be together by blood and marriage. Plans for the formation of a deaf community have frequently been discussed by deaf mutes themselves. The idea designated in the action of Congress endeavoring to establish an Asylum for Deaf Mutes at Hartford is a tract of land and adjacent developed into a number of cottages for the formation of a deaf community. Some of the pupils before graduation formed an agreement to emigrate to the West and form a deaf colony and a number of schemes of a somewhat similar character were in the minds of deaf mutes in different parts of the country. The scheme that received most approval was the purchase of a tract of land by a few wealthy deaf mutes, who were to agree to sell the land in small blocks to other deaf mutes. The whole scheme was afterwards discussed at a convention of deaf mutes of New England, and was overthrown by the influence of several teachers in conjunction with the most intelligent of deaf mutes themselves. Since then the subject has not been publicly discussed, but such a scheme is still favored by individual deaf mutes and may therefore be revived in an organized manner at any time. European philanthropists have commenced the colonization of a tract of land in Manitoba by deaf mutes, upon which a number of deaf mutes with their families from Europe have settled. More are expected next year. Relative to the adoption of remedial measures to lessen the check the formation of a deaf variety of the human race in America, Bell says: "The intermarriage of deaf mutes might be forbidden by legislative enactment, but so long as deaf mutes of both sexes continue to associate together in adult life legislative interference with marriage might only promote immorality. Legislation forbidding intermarriage with persons belonging to families containing one or more deaf mutes would be more practicable, but it is doubtful whether legislative interference would be advisable." The most promising method of lessening the evil, Bell says, appears to be in the adoption of preventive measures in which the deaf mutes themselves should be the retention of the normal environment during the period of education, the establishment of small schools, and the extension of the day school plan. Nearly one-third of the teachers of the deaf and dumb in America are themselves deaf, and this must be considered another element favorable to the formation of a deaf race, and one to be avoided. It is concluded, "The segregation of deaf mutes, the use of a sign language, and the employment of deaf teachers produce an environment unfavorable to the cultivation of articulation and speech reading, and that sometimes causes deafness of speech by speaking pupils who are only deaf."

Three hundred carcasses of mutton were destroyed by a fire in a Kingston slaughterhouse on Monday night.
