THE DENISON GOLD FIELD.

PARTICULARS OF THE WONDERFUL WEALTH OF THE TOUGH MINE. The Richest Auriforous Copper Ore in the Warni-A Party of Chicago Capitalists Visit Benison-R. E. Charless of Manition Mead of the Vermillion Company. For some days back there has been a lull in interest in the Denison gold fields, due in great measure to the fact that no new find have been announced. But The World

succeeded yesterday in eliciting information and saw specimens that must renew interes in this wonderfully rich mineral country. Yesterday a representative of this paper visited at the Union Station the special car of a party of Chicago capitalists who have just sturned from an inspection of their property in Denison. On the Wednesday of last week the car left Chicago with the following or

of Hamilton and ex-mayor of that city, joined the party at Sudbury on their return from the mine.

The party reached the siding on their property to be known hereafter as Ranger (the discoverer of the mines) on Friday afternoon. Ranger is 22 miles west of Sudbury on the Soo branch of the C.P.R. Mr. Coyne, the assistant general manager of the C.P.R. at North Bay, showed every attention to the visitors in the way of getting their car through, etc.

The party remained at the mine from Fri-day afternoon until Tuesday night, when they returned to Sudbury. There are thirty men now at work on the Tough mine, as it is called. They are mainly employed in opening the veins and prospecting. A. G. Duncan, a Canadian, is in charge of the mine. He was a lumberman, and was through this business that he made the ance of Mr. Foster and his friend There is a large boarding house for the men o the property; also a stable and the shed when the hittle three-stamp mill is erected. The mill is running night and day, the power being supplied by a small steam engine. There is also a magazine for aburing supplies. The mine is about two miles in from Ranger siding, a fair bushroad furnishing the connection. Provisions are taken in ou a stone loat. siding, a fair bushroad furnishing the connection. Provisions are taken in on a stone boat. The whole of the land is burnt over—an undergrowth of poplar is coming up. Little or none of the soil is arable.

At thin No. 1 they have developed a bed of copper one that assays 30.90 per cent, of copper and gives \$103 of gold as well to the son. This one is called chalcopyrite. There is an ancount of it in sight. The

is an enormous amount of it in sight. The hole now opened has a floor of this ore twelve feet square, extending in every direction.

It is and to be the richest gold bearing copper ore yet met with. There is also on the property a grey copper ore and a yellow sulphide of copper, both rich in copper but not auxilerous. This chalcopyrite mine is 1500 feet from the gold mine. Organizing the Company.

After their visit to the mine the party resurred to Sudbury, where they held an organion meeting. The company is called the Vermillion Mining Company of Ontario (under the Joint Stock Companies Act) with a capal of \$240,000. All the capital is allo

half of it being given for the property. The half of it being given for the property. The chartes are all assessable to an unlimited amount. One assessment of 5 per cent has been made. The result of the meeting was the election of the following board: B. E. Charlton of Hamilton (President), John Oliver of Chicago (Secretary Treasurer), Robert Hill of Chicago, E. H. Reed of Chicago, Henry Ranger of Sudbury, and V. W. Foster of Chicago. Ranger of Sudbury, and V. W. Foster of Chicago.

The owners discussed what policy they should pursue as to the future. They decided to adopt a liberal policy in the way of encouraging prospectors, and a committee was appointed to ascertain information from western mining countries on this subject. The probability is that prospectors will be invited to work on a basis of an interest in any mine they may open on the company's property of 2800 acres. The company say it will be impossible for themselves to open up more than a small portion of their locations. They have made a few hasty trips further back on their property and have met with some splendid indications of gold and eilver.

The stock in the company is all held as an investment; none of it is for sale. Those holding it are all business men. They are all well satisfied so far and decided at the meeting on taking energetic means to develop the property. They are more than satisfied with their dopper mines. Mr. Hedley of Sudbury hande an assay of this copper for them and reported 30.98 per cent. of copper, as well as gold to the extent of \$105 to the ton.

Col. Hill and Mr. Charlton will return to the mine shortly.
