phor, and calinga, is sent from the country of Chiva 7, 4000 leagues from Calicut. Myrrh from the province of Fastica 8, 700 leagues distant. Calicut produces zeromba 9; and Cananore sends cardamoms, being only twelve leagues distant. Long pepper is found in Same 1°. Benzoin from Zan, 700 miles from Calicut. Zedoary is produced in the territory of Calicut. Lac comes from the city of Samoterra 11, 500 leagues distant. Brasil wood from the region of Tannazar, 500 leagues. Opium from the coast of Adde, 700 leagues.
