

phor, and calinga, is sent from the country of Chiva<sup>7</sup>, 4000 leagues from Calicut. Myrrh from the province of *Fastica*<sup>8</sup>, 700 leagues distant. Calicut produces *zeromba*<sup>9</sup>; and Cananore sends cardamoms, being only twelve leagues distant. Long pepper is found in *Same*<sup>10</sup>. Benzoin from *Zan*, 700 miles from Calicut. Zedoary is produced in the territory of Calicut. Lac comes from the city of *Samoterra*<sup>11</sup>, 500 leagues distant. Brasil wood from the region of *Tannazar*, 500 leagues. Opium from the coast of *Adde*, 700 leagues.
