DEATH TO COCKROACHES.—To destroy cockroaches, sprinkle hellebore on a board slightly wet with molasses. It will be found a tempting, and sure death.

FROZEN WHIPPED CREAM.—To three pints of perfectly sweet, fresh, and thick cream allow one pint of powdered sugar, the whites of two eggs, and a tablespoonful of vanilla. Whip the cream and mix the other ingredients gradually, then freeze.

A GOOD way to prepare old potatoes so that they will be eatable: Mash the potato after boiling, season it with pepper and salt, then with the yolk of an egg (or of more if necessary) make the potatoes into cake and fry them a delicate brown in butter and lard mixed. Have the fat very hot and then the cakes will not be greasy.

FISH SAUCE.—A most appetizing sauce is made by beating four table-spoonfuls of butter until it is like cream; then beat into it gradually a table-spoonful of lemon juice, and one of good strong vinegar, a teaspoonful of chopped parsley, and half a teaspoonful of salt, and a little less than this quantity of black pepper, or if you like the flavour, a pinch of curry powder may be used in place of pepper.

MINCED VEAL.—Take some remnants of roast veal, trim off all brown or hardened portions and chop it finely. Fry a little chopped onion in butter; when it is a light straw colour add a scant tablespoon of flour, a little stock and then the chopped meat with chopped parsley, pepper, salt and nutmeg to taste; mix well; add more stock if necessary, and let the mince gradually heat by the side of the fire. When quite hot stir into it, off the fire, the yolk of an egg and the juice of a lemon strained and beaten up together. Serve with sippets or bread fried in butter round it, and three or four poached eggs on the top.

FOR a roasted ham, make a brown gravy of beef stock thickened with brown flour, and a little lemon juice added.

LEMON FRITTERS.—Take one cup of flour, one egg, half a table-spoonful of batter, one table-spoonful of sugar, one cup of sweet milk, and the juice and grated pulp of one lemon. The grated yellow rind may be added to the sauce.

GRIDDLE CAKES.—Graham griddle cakes are nice for breakfast on a cool summer morning. Use equal parts of Graham and of corn meal, mix with sour milk, and use half a teaspoonful of soda to a scant cup of milk, add salt to your taste, and a little sugar, as that will make them nice and brown. If eggs are plenty one or two are a great addition. These cakes should be fried more slowly than buckwheat cakes.
