"Tender for Trent Canal," will be received at this Office until noon on Saturday, Seventeenth day of November, 1884, for the construction of about five and a half miles of Canal on the Sincoe and Balasm Lake Division, and also for the construction of about three and a half miles of Canal on the Peterboro' and Lake field Division.

"Jans and speenfactions of the work can be seen at the Office of the Chief Engineer of the Department of Italiways and Yanals, at Ottawa, of at the Superinteeding Engineer's Office, Paterboro', where forms of tender can be obtained on and after Monday, Octobe 29th, 1991.

In the case of firms there must be attached the actual signatures of the full mane, the insture of the occupation and place of residence of each member of the sum of \$7,200 must accompany the tender for each section; this accepted cheque insist be end-reed over to the Minister of Railways and Canals, and will be foreigned if the party tendering declines entering into contract for work at the rates and terms stated in the offer submitted. The accepted cheque thus sent in will be returned to the respective parties whose texders are not accepted.


