fall apart, Toronto was brought together by the development of an excellent subway system and a commuter train system which made it the effective center of the whole region.

The new City Hall is the center of the center, with two great curved towers rising above a huge plaza, approached by ramps and fronted by terraces. It has enormous promenades, water for beauty and skating, and it can serve, as Jacobs suggests, as the start of a revitalization. David Molesworth, a Toronto architect, has suggested the next move: "We should work from major center to minor center to quiet area to grass area, to paved area to water."
