Learning or improving skills in the two official languages as well as 40 foreign languages has never been more interesting and more accessible. The multimedia language lab with 40 computers at CFSL's Bisson campus in Hull and the Pearson building library offers a range of cutting edge technology to support your language learning. Interactive CD-ROMS, DVD readers, satellite dishes and receivers are part of the tools on hand for your use. Each computer is equipped with a multilingual word processor to let you write, print and e-mail in the language of your choice. In the lab you may select from six foreign-language specialty television channels. Via the e-lang portal, lab computers allow access to many audio Internet files, including digital radio from many countries.

Maintaining the Language Edge

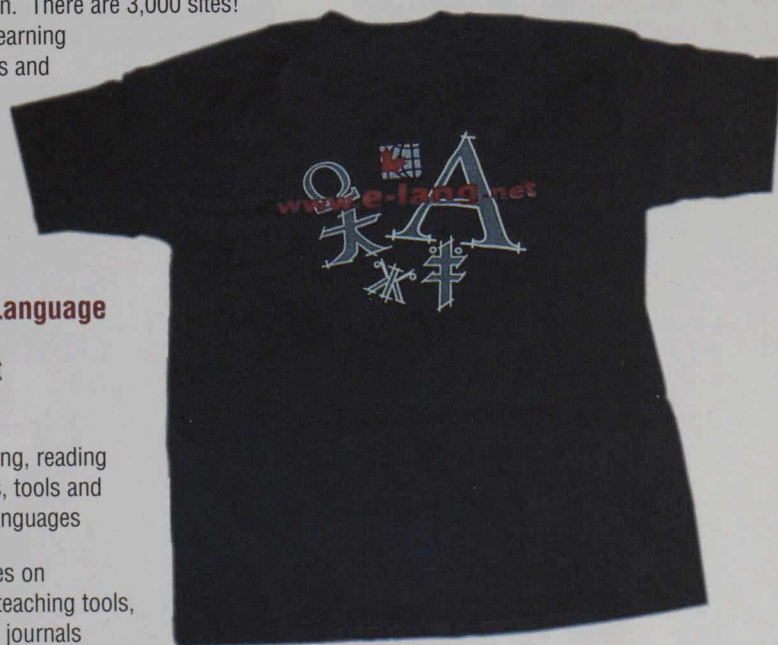
