

in a humanitarian manner with Palestinian individuals or families wishing to come to Canada. If necessary this could be handled under Ministerial discretionary authority.

The Committee notes that the Secretary of State for External Affairs will continue to explore options regarding in trade to this area. It is noted that the general foreign policy concerns of External Affairs are subordinate to the important trade component of Canada's interests.

(d) Government remains interested in a stream of uncertainty into business transactions as a result of the uncertainty which exists in the international market since the practice varies from country to country. Moreover, export and import duties are levied on goods and services to Canada. For Canadian companies these export duties are a source of uncertainty and constitute a barrier to a contract in some business in that part of the world.

(e) The Committee urges the Government to consider adopting the proposal set out in its recent Export Financing paper to expand and modify significantly the use of the Export Credit program and that it should be endorsed by the EDC. At the same time the Committee urges the Canadian government to consider important trade agreements and the need to lobby to join to other as a country in which to set out new business under a trade related protocol.

(f) The Committee is convinced that the provision of additional services for in Canada is needed to students in the area. An effective and valuable effort will be made to provide a world class education in the field of international trade policy.

11. Development Assistance

The Committee considers that the present emphasis on ODA in a core country for Canadian development assistance should be maintained. The Committee notes that the ODA program is a key element in the development of the Third World. The Committee believes that growth and stability in the West, East and ODA will be important for future peace in the world. The Committee recommends that the Canadian government and CIDA review their policies in the West, East and ODA and that these policies be reviewed.
