1. Has any change in mail service to North Brookfield, Pleasant River, and New Elm, Nova Scotia, been made since November 1, 1962, and, if so, what change?

2. Are any changes contemplated in that service?

Mrs. Fairclough: 1. Yes. (a) Effective, November 1, 1962, delivery of mail on South Brookfield rural route No. 1, which serves the North Brookfield, Pleasant River and New Elm area, was changed from afternoon to morning. (b) Effective December 1, 1962, service on this rural route was changed back to afternoon delivery.

2. The department is now looking into the possibility of providing an earlier afternoon delivery of mail to this area.
