

Pro-rated on the basis of enrollments, approximately 25 per cent would have been spent on teaching English and 75 per cent on teaching French.

In addition to the Public Service Commission's expenditures the National Film Board spent \$112,000 for French training and \$28,000 for English training.

2. Ninety-five.

3. Out of a total of 799 airports in Canada (water, land and heliports) seven privately owned airstrips are without fire fighting equipment.

4. Of the 799 Canadian airports, the great majority are not suitable for use by jet aircraft. All airports handling scheduled jet traffic are equipped with fire-fighting equipment to varying degrees of sophistication. The needs of crash fire protection for such traffic are constantly under review by the Department.

5. Yes, as a condition of licensing or operation.
