

Hollinger Soars Again--Shares Reach \$17.50, a New Record

SALES FOR EXPORT DRIVE UP WHEAT

Prices Moved Erratically With
Advance Toward Close—
Corn Given Support.

CHICAGO, March 6.—Export sales here today totaled wheat a cent. Leading houses sold at the top and caused a reaction, but the close was steady 1/4 to 1/2 above last night. Corn finished unchanged to a shade up, oats with a gain of 1/4 to 1/2 and provisions varying from a shade off to 2 1/2 to 3 1/2 advance.

Wheat had a checkered course for the day. Higher prices the first hour were followed by a break to the low point of the week. Then came the sudden bulge and later a quick sale. Bullish reports on the poor quality of wheat remaining in Germany, big reserves in the Dakotas and Minnesota, and finally the revival of export demand here formed the news developments that successively governed quotations. Minneapolis reports that the quality of receipts had been running poor, offset to some extent the continued liberal arrivals there and at Duluth. On the other hand all reports concerning winter crops were on the side of sellers. Seaboard clearances of wheat and flour equalled 37,000 bushels. Primary receipts of wheat were 594,000 bushels against 32,000 bushels a year ago.

Bull leaders gave corn good support on breaks. Wheat strength was also an aid. Contrary influences were the cold, clear weather and the meagreness of shipping demand. Oats had an appearance of strength, but mainly because there was little or no pressure to sell.

Pork advanced sharply, despite profit taking, and closed at the highest price of the year. Other provisions were firm in sympathy.

LIVERPOOL GRAIN EXCHANGE.

LIVERPOOL, March 6.—The eastern American cables and the closing decline in Buenos Ayres yesterday was offset here by some covering by shorts and opening was unchanged to 1/4 lower. The forecast is for lighter Argentine shipments this week. Reports from Italy with cargoes moving and later there was an advance of 1/4 to 1/2 with plate leading. Buenos Ayres closed firm with plate offering dearer, and reports received here of reduced estimates regarding the surplus. American spot was 1/4 higher. Estimates point to larger Argentine shipments this week.

MONTEAL GRAIN AND PRODUCE.

MONTEAL, March 6.—There was a fairly good enquiry from foreign buyers for Manitoba wheat, but the prices bid were very irregular and little business resulted on account of the American market. The local trade in coarse grains shows no improvement, the demand for all lines being slow. There was some enquiry from European sources for spring wheat, and a little business was done for nearby shipment. The local trade is good, and the tone of the market is steady. Demand for millfeed is increasing, and the market is more active. Butter is firm at the recent advance under a good demand for small lots. Cheese firm. Exports for the week were 14,622 boxes, as against 1132 a year ago. Eggs fairly active and firm. Corn—American No. 2 yellow, 61 1/2 to 62 c.

Oats—Canadian western, No. 2, 42c to 42 1/2c; No. 3, 41c to 41 1/2c; extra No. 1 feed, 40c to 41c; No. 2 local white, 38c.
