Make Reasonable  
Demands.

Toronto Street Railway Employees' Union held a mass meeting at the Star Theatre Sunday morning.

The purpose of the meeting was to draft an agreement to be submitted to the Toronto Street Railway Company, as the present agreement made three years ago expired June 15.

President Scott of the union called the members to order shortly after midnight, and the meeting did not adjourn until five o'clock.

Ald. Gibbons, the business agent of the union, in an address to the members said: "This is a most inopportune time for us to make any heavy demands upon the company, and I say this advisedly."

The first order of the business was the election of a motormen and conductors' committee, and a shed and shop committee, to go before the company and place before them the agreement.

Ald. Gibbons and President Scott were appointed to read a draft of several clauses that pertained to the time the men should be on duty, regarding the buying of uniforms, that men employed in the shops should be supplied with badges that would entitle them to free transportation to and from work, that lunch rooms should be opened at each shop and barn.

The most important discussion was on the question of increased wages.

Ald. Gibbons said that there was no one in the company who was not getting a raise in wages, and that the public in general expected them to use good common sense in their demands at this time.

It was finally decided to ask for an increase of one half cent for the first, second and third rate of pay. This amounts to 24, 26 and 28 cents an hour.

**ADVANCE IN WHEAT  
VALUES IN BRITAIN**Board of Trade Returns Show  
Big Decrease in  
Imports.**SHIPPING DIFFICULTY**Striking Increase in Value of  
Bacon, Cheese and Oats

OTTAWA, May 9.—There is again a striking advance in the values of cereals in Great Britain, according to the board of trade returns for the month of March, as compared with the corresponding month of last year.

There was an increase in the value of the wheat exported of \$550,585.

The decrease in the quantity of wheat, meal and flour imported was \$1,782,496 bushels, and increase in value \$275,455.

The probability is that the decrease in the quantity exported has been due to the difficulties of transport.

There is an increase in the value of the export of oats of \$66,295; bacon, \$1,575; cheese, \$671,845, and smaller increases in other commodities.
