THE maps in Bartholomew's Literary and Historical Atlas of Europe and in the similar Atlas of Asia, both published in the "Everyman" series (Cloth, Is.), are convenient and for most purposes sufficient. For this reason the insertion of maps into the present volumes has been regarded as unnecessary. Maps of the several guberni of European Russia, on a scale of about 20 miles to 1 inch, are to be found in Brockhaus and Ephron's Encyclopædia.
