place where there was regular wall was at the celiar at the south-west. I cannot tell if the inside of the cellar wall was perpendicular or not. I think the depth of the cellar from the surface 350 was about from four to five feet. I did not notice any floor in the cellar. The only wall around the cellur I noticed was inside the house. The plaintiff does not live on the property now. The plaintiff has not lived on it for over twenty years. James H. Reynolds was living at Musquodoboit when the honse was moved away. I don't know to my knowledge that my brother ever spoke of the property as James H. Reynolds'. Wellwood told me that James H. Reynolds had bargained with him for the farm. I understood from both of them that there was a borg, in between them.
