During 7 Months 67,728 Went There, While 57,249 Came Along to Canada.

London, Sept. 16.—British government returns show that between Dec. 31, 1904, and July 31, 1905, 57,249 persons of British origin emigrated to Canada, an increase of 10,000 over the number of British emigrants during the cor:esponding period of last year. Australasia took only 5235, but this number was 460 more than in the corresponding eriod of last year.

The emigrations to India showed a decrease of 278, the number being 1421. The quota to British South Africa for
