ment of the Bank of England shows the following charges, as compared with the previous 'account: 'I'otal reserve, in-creased £74,000; circulation decreased, £290,000; bullion decreased, £216,469; other securities decreased, £320,000; oth-er deposits decreased £126,000; public deposits, decreased, £119,000; notes re-serve, increased, £119,000. Government securities unchanged. 'The proportion of the Bank of England's reserve to lia-bility, which last week was 43.02 per bility, which last week was 43.02 per cent, is now 43.35 per cent. The rate of discount of the Bank of England re-mains unchanged at 3 per cent.


