

FIRE DEATH DESTRUCTION

**Blaze at Pittsburg Yesterday Caused
the Loss of One Life and Con-
sumed a Dozen Buildings.**

A SCORE OF FAMILIES HOMELESS.

**The Life Lost Was That of a Child
Whose Mother Fell While
Rushing for Safety.**

Pittsburg, Pa., April 29.—Fire at the corner of Carson and 17th-streets, South-side, to-day, cost one life, a property loss estimated at \$225,000, consumed over a dozen buildings and rendered a score of

at first a well-founded report that eight persons had perished. This was happily proven untrue after the fire had been controlled, the only fatality being the burning to death of Mrs. Kate Donley's 2½-year-old child. When the fire broke out Mrs. Donley and child were on the fourth floor

**Judgment for the Plaintiff in a
Case That Has Agitated
Napanee Citizens.**

Chief Justice Falconbridge has handed out judgment in a Napanee case, which

excited much interest in that town. The plaintiff, Charles Stevens, publisher of the Napanee Star, manufacturer of apple barrels and wholesale dealer in leached ashes and fertilizers, sued Dennis H. A. Daly, private banker, money-lender and wholesale tea merchant, for \$10,000 damages for wrongful seizure under a chattel mortgage which the plaintiff had given the defendant. The judgment delivered yesterday awards the plaintiff \$200 and costs.
