of discussing the situation. The United Mine Workers have all along been toward in their support of the strike, and the firemen insisted that they define their position, once for all, as it was impossible to carry on the strike if the United Mine Workers objected to it.

These questions were submitted by the firemen to the Mine Workers: Will you withdraw all men of your organization out of positions if strike is declared off? Will you use your influence to have all engineers and others reinstated to their position if strike is declared off?

Will you allow us to meet United Mine Workers in joint convention, and to present grievances at the meeting? To the first two questions an affirmative reply was given. To the third, this reply was made: "Yes, if you join the United Mine Workers."

A resolution was adopted, calling on the Firemen's Committee of the Firemen's Association to call on each coal company to-morrow and ascertain if the men who went out on strike, and if they were back their positions. These committees are to make a report to the same at a meeting to be held to-morrow.
